- 3.5 core GPA, or 3.8 in subject area
- Teacher recommendation
- Minimum standardized test score

* NOTE: A student may meet all above requirements yet may *not* get a recommendation from current teacher.

Honors Courses & Summer Work

- Some honors courses require summer work.
- Incomplete summer work is not a reason to drop a course you are still expected to take the course you registered for and will likely take a "O" on the assignments that are missing.
- Communicate with the teacher they make themselves accessible through the summer.

Early Middle College

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EMC allows all Sophomores an opportunity to earn:

- High School Diploma
- Associates Degree from LMC or Occupational Certificate from LMC
- During grades 11, 12, and "13"

* The final "13^{th"} year is completely on LMC campus as a college student.

Students receive free tuition, books and fees to participate in EMC for three years—grades 11, 12, and 13.

Math Dual Literacy

- Supports what the student is doing in their Algebra class (extra practice using online tools).
- Students should have their Algebra homework complete on their own (although help is provided).
- Quarterly grades based on effort, no semester exam.
- Work on strengthening deficit skills (using those online tools).

Honors Math Classes

- Increased academic expectations & workload
- Possibility for summer assignments
- More difficult to earn an A
- Increased learning
- Build a stronger foundation for future classes that can earn college credit

Recommendations for Science

Physical Science

- Concurrently enrolled in Algebra (not Geometry)
- Students who have challenges in the areas of Math and/or English, organization, time management

Biology

- The majority of students enroll in Biology
- Concurrently enrolled in Algebra or Geometry

Honors Biology

- NWEA Test Scores help with placement
- Middle School Core GPA 3.3
- Concurrently enrolled in Geometry or higher math class
- Excellent study habits, organization, and time management skills

Reading Dual Literacy

- Works to strengthen skills in reading comprehension, vocabulary, spelling, reading fluency, and writing through the READ 180 program.
- Provides time for independent reading.
- Supports what the students are doing in their English class.
- Provides differentiated instruction and one-on-one and small group instruction.
- Quarterly grades based on effort and READ 180 results. No semester exam.

Honors English at SJHS

- Summer novel reading + writing assignments: 2-4 total works.
- Grade-level curriculum is followed but supplemented:
 - Reading: 5+ more books
 - Writing: 6+ more pieces; longer, assessed at higher level
 - Solid competency of grammar rules and writing structure
 Higher-level thinking skills/Socratic seminar skills
- Homework: Daily, weekends, and breaks.
- Recommendations based on core GPA, writing proficiency of 8th grade work, and benchmark tests.
- Students score in top percentiles, especially in reading and writing. At least a B average to advance to next level of honors.
- Need excellent time management skills and strong study habits.
- It is more difficult to get an A.




